We teachers are there to ensure the safety of your children, facilitate their journey, as well as take care of them if they are having a difficult time. That being said, The Japan Expedition is by no means a "fun trip." Your children will be sweating, both literally and figuratively. However, all students will face all challenges together with their classmates and with the love and support of their experienced teachers.

• How can I communicate with my child during the Expedition? Steveo will send 3 updates to the school community during the Expedition. Students are asked not to initiate contact with home, so please do not place your student in a moral dilemma by asking him/her to email or phone you. Please use standard mail and allow about one week for mail to arrive. Mail is a key element to keeping up high spirits in Japan, so please keep your mail topics light and the tone positive. Please don't send anything by express mail.

Packing List Discussion

This is to complement the attached packing list, with advice on packing and what kind of equipment to buy.

Some Quick Tips:

Don't buy anything new if you can help it! There should only be one item you will need to buy, and that is the **down jacket** you will use for the cold conditions on Mt. Fuji. Please take advantage of the wonderful Odyssey community and borrow any items (such as luggage) that you don't already own.

Less is better. Pack only what is on the packing list. Students will be responsible for carrying all of their own luggage. Heavy or unwieldy luggage places a burden on the group as a whole.

Use Ziploc bags in order to compartmentalize different items such as underwear, socks, and shirts. Students are expected to pack and repack bags every night. Ziploc bags will also protect from water damage.

Bags:

• Main Bag: All students need a carry-on sized roller bag. You can find examples of good bags below, all of which came priced at \$23 to \$40. The dimensions of these are roughly 22" x 14" x 9." This is the largest-sized carry-on permitted by airlines. If you have any questions, please check with Odyssey staff.







 Day Pack: This should be like a typical backpack for school. The daypack should be comfortable – remember you are climbing a mountain with it on your back! Criteria include: adjustable straps, big enough to hold all the items indicated for "day pack" in the pack list, and outside pockets to allow quick access to a change purse or water. No wheels or messenger-style bags.



Clothing:

- Under-clothing, including socks, should be easy to wash and hang-dry as well as antimicrobial to prevent smell.
- Uniform clothes/Other clothes notes: Odyssey will provide the Odyssey uniform collared shirts indicated in the pack list. Students will need to bring 3 pairs of Dockers-style khaki colored pants to be worn as part of their uniform. The pants should be wrinkle-resistant. One pair of the khaki pants can be shorts with at least a 6-inch inseam, or a knee-length skirt.



- Down Jacket: All students are required to purchase a Uniqlo "Ultra Light Down" or something very similar. These can be found easily on the Uniqlo website or at the Uniqlo store locations (Hillsdale, San Francisco, Milpitas, San Jose) Either the men's or the women's version is fine. These jackets are perfect for our needs on Mt. Fuji because they are both very warm and also are extremely compact when packed.
- Cultural appropriateness: Japanese people tend to cover their shoulders, so we ask students to not bring tank tops. Likewise, we ask that students not bring make-up as it is inappropriate for their age group on a school trip.

Gifts:

• For homestay families: It is customary to bring a gift with you when visiting a home in Japan. Since Japanese houses are small and tend to get cluttered easily, it's best to give something consumable. Goods that you can only find in California are the best. Do not give a gift with an even number of items (like a set of 4 postcards) – keep your numbers odd! Gifts should always be wrapped as nicely as



possible. Try not to make the gift too expensive as it can shame the host family.

- Special gift for your homestay: Shinonome host students are around the same age as an Odyssey student, and Tokiwagi students are significantly older (16/17 years old), but both will be interested and excited in anything very culturally American. Small memorabilia with English phrases or sports team logos, cute American stationery, a mix CD with music you like these are thoughtful gifts that reflect your personality without being too over-the-top or culturally insensitive in any way.
- Small Travel Gifts: Students will want to give something small to the many people who will have helped them. Gift items like stickers, bookmarks, or even candy are easy to carry around.

Other Items:

- Camera: A disposable camera works, as well as a digital camera. Make sure to bring a charger with a two-pronged wall plug.
- Headphones: Students may bring a set of small earbuds for use on the airplane.
- Pack-Towel: This is a small camping towel you can find at REI. Do not bring a large bath towel as you will not be able to dry it.
- Feminine products: You can buy these items in convenience stores in Japan, but many find American versions to be more familiar/comfortable
- Money: Odyssey covers all trip expenses.
 Students should bring 30,000 yen (\$300) for: snacks, drinks, independent activities, and treating host families to dinner. Please have students come with their money in two
 - envelopes with their name and the dollar amount on each envelope. The envelopes should have 15,000 yen (about \$150) each. Teachers will keep track of student spending money.
